- PET/PST (for Havaldar)
- Document Verification

4) SSC GD Selection

- CBT Exam
- Physical Test (PET/PST)
- Medical Test

- **SSC MTS:** 10th Pass
- **SSC GD:** 10th Pass
- **SSC CPO:** Graduation

Age Limit (General Category)

- SSC CGL: 18 to 32 years (varies by post)
- SSC CHSL: 18 to 27 years
- SSC MTS: 18 to 25 years
- SSC GD: 18 to 23 years
- SSC CPO: 20 to 25 years

(Age relaxation applies for reserved categories.)
