Current Affairs Related to 4th April 2025

- by the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare to collect real-time crop sown information directly from the field through a mobile interface. This innovative system ensures accurate, updated information on crop areas for each agricultural plot, which will be crucial for accurate production estimates. As part of this initiative, Agri Stack has been developed in compliance with the Digital Personal Data Protection Act 2023 and other IT laws of India.
- A Memorandum of Understanding has been signed between the Government of Himachal Pradesh and the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization. The objective of the MoU is to improve the quality of education in Himachal Pradesh. As part of the MoU, UNESCO will assist Himachal Pradesh in modernizing its education system. The MoU also emphasizes on integrating green education, environmental awareness and sustainable development into the school curriculum.
- The Ministry of Defence has signed a contract with Bharat Forge Limited for the purchase of 155 mm/52 caliber Advanced Towed Artillery Gun System. A contract was also signed with Tata Advanced System Limited for the acquisition of High Mobility Vehicle 6x6 Gun Towing Vehicles. The total cost of these contracts is around Rs 6900 crore. With this agreement, a total of Rs 1.40 lakh crore worth of contracts have been signed by the Ministry of Defence for capital procurement so far in the current financial year 2024-2025.
- The book Ripples of Change on women-led rural WASH initiatives was released by the Jal Shakti Minister. The book was published by the Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation in collaboration with UNICEF India. Ripples of Change features ten powerful women from rural India. These stories documented by UNICEF reflect the transformative impact of Swachh Bharat Mission and Jal Jeevan Mission through gender empowerment, community leadership and grassroots innovation.
- ◆ The Chief Minister of Sikkim has proposed a budget of Rs 16,196 crore for 2025-2026. The budget includes a revenue expenditure of Rs 11,028 crore and a capital outlay of Rs 5168 crore.

- Addressing an event in New Delhi, Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said about Rs 11 lakh crore is being invested in various industries. He said Indian Railways is expected to become the second largest carrier this year, handling 1.6 billion tonnes. He stressed that ports in India are also growing rapidly. Electronic manufacturing in India, which was minimal a decade ago, has now become a major export sector.
- After three days of talks in Saudi Arabia, Russia and Ukraine have agreed to a naval ceasefire in the Black Sea in separate agreements with the US. The two countries agreed to safe navigation in the Black Sea. They will not attack each other's energy systems. Russia said the naval ceasefire will only come into effect if sanctions against its food and fertilizer trade are lifted. Ukraine and Russia are both major grain exporters, and prices have hit a new high since the start of the war.
- The government announced the discontinuation of the medium-term and long-term government deposit components of the Gold Monetisation Scheme. Accordingly, no gold deposited at designated collection and purity testing centres or GM mobilisation, collection and testing agents or designated bank branches under the said components of the GMS will be accepted. The Gold Monetisation Scheme was announced on 15 September 2015. The GMS originally consisted of three components, short-term bank deposits, medium-term government deposits, and long-term government deposits.
- The Lok Sabha passed the Boiler Bill 2024 for regulation of boilers, protection of life and property of people from the danger of explosion of steam boilers, and uniformity in registration. The Boiler Bill 2024 will repeal the hundred-year-old Boiler Act 1923. The bill was passed by the Rajya Sabha in December 2024. The bill has provisions to ensure the safety of people working inside boilers and promote ease of doing business.
- The Indian Space Research Organisation has completed the rolling experiment as part of its Space Docking Experiment mission.
